IV. The Son of God and His ministry to His disciples - 13:1-16:33

A. the ministry of Christ as He washes the disciples' feet - 13:1-17

1. Jesus loved His disciples to the very end - 13:1-4

a. Jesus knew that His hour had come - 13:1

this came at the time of the Passover
the time was coming for Christ to leave this world
Jesus was going to return to heaven - John 14:2
the time was coming for Christ to return to the Father
Christ loved His own who were in the world
Jesus would command them to love with His love - John 13:34-35
Christ loved His own until the end
Jesus would later pray for His followers - John 17:9-19

b. Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him - 13:2

Jesus and the disciples finished eating the supper
none of the disciples had volunteered to wash their feet - John 13:12
Jesus knew what the devil had put in the heart of Judas
Satan took complete control of Judas a short time later - John 13:27
Jesus knew that Judas was going to betray Him
Jesus had predicted this much earlier - John 6:70-71

c. Jesus knew that He would return to the Father - 13:3

Jesus knew that all things were given into His hands
Jesus knew that He had come from God
Jesus knew that He would return to God
Jesus would tell the disciples He was returning to the Father - John 16:28

d. Jesus prepared to wash the feet of the disciples - 13:4

Jesus rose from the table
Jesus laid aside his garments
Jesus took the towel of a servant
Jesus gave us an example to follow - John 13:15-17

2. Jesus washed the feet of the disciples - 13:5-9

a. Jesus began to wash the feet of the disciples - 13:5

Jesus poured water and began to wash the feet of the disciples
service to one another is best learned by example - John 13:15
Jesus then wiped their feet with the towel He had taken
Jesus was willing to humble Himself like Mary - John 12:3

b. Jesus prepared to wash the feet of Peter - 13:6

Jesus came to Peter as He was washing their feet
Peter was usually the spokesman for the disciples - Matt. 16:13-16
Peter asked Jesus if he was going to wash his feet
Peter had sat through the meal like the other disciples - John 13:2

c. Jesus said that Peter would understand later - 13:7

Jesus told Peter he did not know what Jesus was doing now
Peter was being taught to have spiritual understanding - Matt. 16:22-23
Peter needed the Holy Spirit to teach Him - John 14:26
Peter needed the Spirit to give him understanding - I Cor. 2:12-13
Jesus told Peter that he would understand later
Peter would later understand the need for spiritual cleansing - I John 1:7-9
Peter needed Jesus to open his understanding - Luke 24:45

d. Jesus said it was necessary to wash the feet of Peter - 13:8

Peter said Jesus would never wash his feet
Peter was embarrassed for not serving Christ - John 13:13-14
Peter heard what would happen if his feet were not washed
Peter did not know what he would do that night - Luke 22:31-34
Peter heard that he would have no part with Christ
there is no fellowship without cleansing - I John 1:5-9

e. Jesus heard Peter ask to be washed all over - 13:9

Peter immediately changed his words
Peter wanted to be used by Christ - Luke 5:8-11
Peter was ready to have his whole body washed
Peter greatly loved Christ and wanted to serve Him - John 21:17

3. Jesus explained that He was their Master and served them - 13:10-13

a. Jesus said that those who are washed only need their feet washed - 13:10

Jesus said those who are washed only need to be cleansed

confession of sins (cleansing) is needed daily - I John 1:9

Jesus said those who are washed are entirely clean

Christ saved us through the washing of regeneration - Titus 3:5

Christ puts righteousness to our account - Rom. 4:3,4,5,6,8,10,11,22,23,24

Paul learned that salvation (washing) is only need once - Acts 22:16

Jesus said that there was one who was not clean

Judas would soon be possessed by Satan himself - John 13:26

b. Jesus said that they were not all clean - 13:11

Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him

Jesus would tell the disciples one would betray Him - John 13:21

Jesus would tell Judas to do what he had to do - John 13:27

Jesus knew that Judas have never believed in Him

Jesus fully understood the character of Judas - John 6:70

c. Jesus finished washing their feet and then took His place again - 13:12

Jesus then finished washing the feet of the disciples

Jesus wanted them to think as they watched Him - John 13:15-17

Jesus then put his outer garments back on

Jesus had laid aside these garments earlier - John 13:4

Jesus went and sat back down where he had been seated

Jesus had earlier left the table and gotten a towel - John 13:4

Jesus asked the disciples if they knew what He had just done

Jesus continually asked questions to test their understanding - John 6:6

d. Jesus said that they called Him Teacher and Lord - 13:13

Jesus said that they called Him Teacher

Jesus often invited people to learn from Him - Matt. 11:29

Jesus said that they called Him Lord

to call a person Lord also meant one was to obey - Luke 6:46

Jesus said that they were right

Jesus said they were to follow the example of their Teacher - John 13:14

Peter said later that he had learned from Jesus' example - I Pet. 2:21

4. Jesus said He gave them an example of serving one another - 13:14-17

a. Jesus said that they also ought to wash each others' feet - 13:14

Christ is the Lord and Teacher

every mature disciple will be like his teacher - Luke 6:40

Christ had washed the feet of the disciples

the disciples saw the actions of Christ - John 13:4-5

Christ had shown them they were to serve one another

we are to serve one another in love - Gal. 5:13

b. Jesus said that He had given them an example - 13:15

Christ gave the disciples an example to follow

we are to follow the example and pattern of Christ - Heb. 8:5

we are to do this because He gave us a better example - Heb. 8:6

Christ said we should do as He has done

we are to follow in His steps - I Pet. 2:21

c. Jesus said the servant is not greater than the lord - 13:16

Christ said the servant is not greater than his master

Christ had called the disciples to be His servants - John 15:15

Christ said obedience changes servants into friends - John 15:14-15

Christ now calls us His brethren- John 20:17

Christ is not ashamed to call all the sanctified His brethren - Heb. 2:11

Christ said the one who is sent is not greater than the sender

the one who sends is the one with authority - Luke 7:8

Christ said that He had been sent by the Father - John 6:38

Christ said that He now sends us - John 20:21, Matt. 28:18-20

d. Jesus said they were both to know and to do - 13:17

Christ said we are to know and understand these things

we are to know what Christ teaches - II Tim. 2:15

we are to understand what Christ teaches - Luke 24:27, 32, 45

we are to obey what Christ teaches - James 1:22

Christ said we will be happy if we will do these things

we are to obey Christ not just know what He said - John 15:14

we are to love one another as Christ loved us - John 13:34-35

we will be filled with joy and peace as we obey - Phil. 4:4-9

B. the ministry of Christ as He predicts His betrayal - 13:18-38

1. Jesus predicted that one lift up his heel against Jesus - 13:18-21

a. Jesus said that one disciple would turn against Him - 13:18

Jesus spoke of what one disciple would do

Jesus knew what Judas was going to do - John 18:2

Jesus knew the disciples that He had chosen

Christ chose the twelve to be with Him - Mark 3:13-14

Christ chose the eleven to also be fruitful - John 15:16

Christ also chose them to do greater works - John 14:12

Jesus knew that one disciples would fulfill the Scripture

the prophecy about Judas is in Psalm 41:9

Jesus knew that one would turn against Him

Jesus even knew when Judas would betray Him - Matt. 26:46

b. Jesus was telling the disciples this in advance - 13:19

Jesus told the other disciples before it happened

Jesus told the disciples many things in advance - Matt. 17:9

Jesus said this would cause them to believe

Jesus did what He did to cause the disciples to believe - John 2:11

c. Jesus knew that the others would receive Him - 13:20

Jesus said that those who receive them receive Him

those who would accept them would accept Jesus - Luke 10:8-10

those who would hate them hated Jesus first - John 15:18

Jesus said that those who receive Him receive the Father

those who receive Jesus also received the Father - John 14:8-11

those who hated Jesus also hated the Father - John 15:23

d. Jesus said that one of them would betray Him - 13:21

Jesus was then troubled in spirit

Christ later experienced great agony - Luke 22:43-44

Jesus then told them exactly what would happen

Christ predicted His betrayal - John 13:26-27

Jesus said that one of them would betray Him

Christ knew what Judas would do - John 19:2

2. Jesus heard the disciples ask if they would betray Him - 13:22-26

a. the disciples did not know about whom Jesus was talking - 13:22

the disciples all looked at each other
the disciples did not know which one Christ meant
the disciples wondered about themselves not Judas - Matt. 26:22

b. the disciple Jesus loved was sitting next to Him - 13:23

one of the disciples was leaning against Jesus
John never uses his own name but calls himself the disciple Jesus loved
one of the disciples knew that He was loved by Jesus
John used the same title for himself the next day - John 19:26

c. the disciple Jesus loved received a message from Peter - 13:24

Peter wanted to know who Jesus was talking about
Peter was the one who usually did the talking - Matt. 16:16; 17:4
Peter signaled to John to ask Jesus their question
the other disciples did not ask Christ - Luke 22:23
the other disciples had their attention on something else - Luke 22:24
Peter wanted John to ask who would betray Jesus
Peter later learned what he would do - Luke 22:31-32
Peter thought he could never do such a thing - Luke 22:33-34
Peter found out how weak we are in ourselves - John 18:25-27

d. the disciple Jesus loved asked who would betray Him - 13:25

John then asked Jesus a direct question
the disciples wondered who would do such a thing - Luke 22:23
John asked who would betray the Lord
none of the disciples seemed to understand the answer of Jesus - John 13:28-29

e. the disciple Jesus loved had his question answered - 13:26

Jesus said He would give the person a piece of bread
the person would dip at the same time as Christ - Mark 14:20
Jesus then dipped the bread and gave it to Judas Iscariot
Judas also asked if he was the one who would betray Christ - Matt. 26:23-25
Judas was the son of Simon

3. Jesus told Judas to do what he did quickly - 13:27-30

a. Judas had Satan enter into him - 13:27

Judas became possessed by Satan
his life was spiritually empty - Matt. 12:43-45
Judas then had Christ speak to him
Jesus knew what Judas was going to do - John 6:71
Judas was told to do what he had to do quickly
Judas knew exactly where he would find Christ - John 19:2-3

b. Judas was going to do something the disciples did not understand - 13:28

the disciples did not realize what Judas was going to do
the disciples heard but they didn't hear - Luke 22:21-24
the disciples did not realize what Jesus had just shown about Judas
Jesus treated Judas with respect right to the end - Matt. 26:50
the other disciples never suspected Judas - Matt. 26:22

c. Judas was the one who served as treasurer - 13:29

the disciples knew that Judas carried the money bag
Christ gave Judas the opportunity to know his own character - John 12:4-6
the disciples thought Jesus had told him to buy something
Christ gave different responsibilities to various disciples - Luke 22:7-13
the disciples thought he might be getting things for the feast
this happened the night of the Passover - Matt. 26:19-21
the disciples thought he might be giving something to the poor
Christ had a great concern for the poor - Matt. 19:21; Luke 4:18

d. Judas then went out immediately - 13:30

Judas received the piece of bread
Jesus gave Judas the piece of bread - John 13:26
Judas immediately left the upper room
then Jesus gave some of His most important teachings - John 13:31-16:33
Judas went out into the night
men use darkness to cover their evil actions - John 3:19
this was both physical and spiritual darkness - I John 1:6
spiritual darkness is great darkness - Matt. 6:23
the spiritually blind cannot lead - Luke 6:39

4. Jesus gave a new commandment to the disciples - 13:31-35

a. Jesus said He would be glorified - 13:31-32

Jesus waited until Judas went out

Jesus told the disciples that the Son of man was glorified
Jesus would soon sit at the right hand of the Father - Heb. 12:2

Jesus said that God would be glorified in Him
Jesus also brought glory to the Father - John 17:4

Jesus said that the Father would also glorify Him
the Father is the One who glorified the Son - John 17:2

Jesus said the Father would glorify Him
Jesus would be exalted by the Father - Phil. 2:9-11

b. Jesus told the disciples He would be leaving them - 13:33

Jesus said He would only be with them a little while longer
the time would soon come when they would not see Him - John 16:16

Jesus said that the disciples would seek Him
Jesus also explained what He meant - John 16:19-23

Jesus said that He was now telling them what He told the Jews
Jesus had told the Jews they would seek Him and not find Him - John 7:34

Jesus said the disciples could not come where he was going
Jesus would soon return to the Father - John 16:28
Jesus was going to prepare a place for them - John 14:2

c. Jesus gave the disciples a new commandment - 13:34-35

Jesus gave the disciples a new commandment
this commandment was repeated again by Christ - John 15:12
this love is described for us in I Corinthians 13:4-8a

Jesus said the new commandment was to love one another
the commandment summarizes the entire New Testament - I John 4:10-11
(the statement love one another appears a dozen times in the New Testament)

Jesus said they were to love one another as He loved them
this love requires that we understand Christ's love for us - I John 3:16

this love requires actions and not just words - I John 3:18

this love comes from God - I John 4:7-10

this love gives us boldness in the day of judgment - I John 4:17

this love takes away fear - I John 4:18

this love will produce oneness in Christians - John 17:20-23

5. Jesus predicted that Peter would deny Him - 13:36-38

a. Peter asked Jesus why he could not go with Him - 13:36

Peter asked Jesus where He was going

Peter had a great desire to be with Jesus - Mark 14:29

Peter heard he could not follow Jesus where He was going right then

Jesus said the sheep of His flock would be scattered that night - Matt. 26:31

Peter heard he would follow Christ at a later time

Peter did not fear death at a later time - Acts 12:3-11

b. Peter said that he would lay down his life for Jesus - 13:37

Peter asked why he could not follow Christ

Peter was sure that he would stand firm - Mark 14:31

Peter said that he would lay down his life for Christ

Peter said he would die before he would deny - Matt. 26:34

Peter was depending on his own strength - John 15:5

c. Peter was told he would deny Jesus three times - 13:38

Jesus asked Peter if he would really lay down his life

Christ told Peter that Satan wanted to sift him like wheat - Luke 22:31

Christ knew Peter would sleep instead of pray - Luke 22:45-46

Christ knew Peter would be strong when he was next to Christ - John 18:10-11

Christ knew that Peter and the others would flee that night - Mark 9:50

Christ knew Peter would follow Him at a distance - Luke 22:54

Christ knew Peter would sit down among the enemies - Luke 22:55

Christ knew that Peter would deny Him three times - Luke 23 56-60

Christ knew that Peter would remember and weep - Luke 22:61-62

Christ knew that Peter would decide to go back to fishing - John 21:3

Christ knew that He would restore Peter - John 21:15-17

Christ knew that Peter would one day really lay down his life - John 21:18-19

Jesus told Peter that he would not lay down his life that night

Peter was told what he would really do that night - Mark 14:26-31

Jesus told Peter that would change before the rooster crowed

Peter did deny Jesus three times before the rooster crowed - Matt. 26:69-75

Jesus told Peter that he would deny Him three times that night

Peter denied Jesus the first time - John 18:17

Peter denied Jesus the second time - John 18:25

Peter denied Jesus the third time - John 18:26-27

C. The ministry of Christ as He comforts His disciples - 14:1-31

1. Jesus explained that He was going to prepare a place in heaven - 14:1-4

a. Jesus told the disciples that they did not need to be troubled - 14:1

Jesus told the disciples not to be troubled

Jesus is the Prince of Peace - Isaiah 9:6-7
Jesus wants us to experience peace - John 14:26
Jesus says we can have peace because He has overcome the world - John 16:33
we are to replace our troubled thoughts with God's thoughts - Phil. 4:4-9
Jesus reminded the disciples that they believed in God
the Father had given witness of Christ - John 5:37-38
Jesus encouraged the disciples to believe in Him
Jesus told them why they could believe in Him - John 14:11-12

b. Jesus told the disciples that He would prepare a place for them - 14:2

Jesus said there were many mansions in His Father's house
heaven is where the throne of God is - Col. 3:1
Jesus said He would have told them if that was not a fact
Jesus wanted the disciples to know about the future - John 14:29
Jesus said that He was going to prepare a place for them
heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people - Rev. 21:1-8

c. Jesus said He would take them to that place - 14:3

Jesus said that He would come again
this coming will cause Christians to be changed - I Cor. 15:51-54
Jesus said that He would take the disciples to Himself
this coming will be for Christians at the Rapture - I Thess. 4:13-18
Jesus said that the disciples would be with Him
this coming means we will be with the Lord forever - I Thess. 4:17-18

d. Jesus said they knew where He was going - 14:4

Jesus said they knew where He was going
Jesus was going to the Father - John 16:16
Jesus said that they knew the way to where He was going
Jesus told them that He is the way to heaven - John 14:6

2. Jesus answered the question of Thomas - John 14:5-7

a. Jesus was told the disciples did not know the way to the Father - 14:5

Thomas told Jesus they did not know where He was going
the disciples continued to question what Jesus meant - John 16:17
Thomas told Jesus they wanted to know the way to where He was going
Jesus would be lifted up so that He could be the way - John 3:15-16

b. Jesus said that He is the way to the Father - 14:6

(Three things Adam lost when he sinned)
Adam lost his way - He listened to Satan
Adam and Eve listened to Satan - Gen. 3:4-6
Adam lost the truth - He accepted the lie of Satan
Satan is the Father of lies - John 8:44
Adam lost his life - He experienced spiritual death
Adam experienced separation from God when he sinned - Gen. 2:17; 3:8

Jesus said that He is the way
this is the sixth "I AM" in the book of John
Jesus reconciled us to God - II Cor. 5:18

Jesus said that He is the truth
Jesus is the truth that sets us free - John 8:32, 36
those who know the truth hear Christ - John 18:37-38

Jesus said that He is the life
Jesus came to give us abundant life - John 10:11
Jesus is the resurrection and the life - John 11:25

Jesus said He was the only way to come to the Father
Jesus is the door by which we enter in - John 10:9
Jesus is the only One who can save - Acts 4:12

c. Jesus said that they knew the Father and had seen Him - 14:7

Jesus said that if they knew Him they also knew the Father
Jesus said that He and the Father are One - John 10:30
Jesus said that from this time they now knew the Father
Jesus revealed the Father to us - John 1:14
Jesus is in the Father and the Father in Him - John 10:38
Jesus said that they had now seen the Father
Jesus came to reveal the Father - John 1:18

3. Jesus answered the request of Philip - 14:8-11

a. Jesus heard the request of Philip to see the Father - 14:8

Philip asked Christ to show them the Father
the people had not seen the Father before this time - John 1:18

Philip said that would satisfy them
Moses had made a similar request - Ex. 33:18-23

b. Jesus told Philip that Philip knew Him - 14:9

Jesus said that He had been a long time with the disciples
Jesus had chosen them to be with Him - Mark 3:14

Jesus asked if Philip did not yet know Him
Paul told how we get to know Christ better - Phil. 3:10

Jesus said to see Him is to see the Father
Jesus was with God and was God - John 1:1-2

Jesus asked why he questioned how to see the Father
Jesus had seen the Father and revealed Him - John 6:46-47

c. Jesus said that He spoke the words of the Father - 14:10

Jesus asked if Philip believed He was in the Father
Jesus said that He was in the Father - John 17:21

Jesus asked if Philip believed the Father was in Him
Jesus later said that the Father was in Him - John 17:23

Jesus said that He spoke the words of the Father
Jesus spoke the words of the Father - John 14:24

Jesus said that the Father lived in Him
Jesus later said again that the Father lived in Him - John 17:21

Jesus said that the Father did the works
Jesus did His works in conjunction with the Father - John 5:19-20

d. Jesus said that He did the works of the Father - 14:11

Jesus asked Philip to believe that He was in the Father
Jesus said He and the Father are One - John 10:30

Jesus asked Philip to believe that the Father was in Him
Jesus said to see Him was to see the Father - John 12:45

Jesus asked Him to believe because of the works that he had seen
Jesus said His works were done in the name of the Father - John 10:25, 32, 38

4. Jesus promised to answer prayer - 14:12-14

a. Jesus said that the disciples would do greater works - 14:12

Jesus gave a promise to those who believe on Him

Jesus continued to invite people to believe in Him - John 3:15-16

Jesus said those who believe would also do His works

the believers were empowered to speak with boldness - Acts 4:31

Jesus said those who believe would do greater works

the believers would extend His works around the world - Acts 1:8

the believers would turn the world upside down - Acts 17:6

Jesus said this would happen because He went to the Father

Jesus said He would send another Comforter - John 14:16

Jesus said this would happen after He went away - John 16:7

Jesus said they were to wait for power from on high - Luke 24:49

Jesus said He would baptize them with the Holy Spirit - Acts 1:5

Jesus said the Spirit would give them power to witness - Acts 1:8

b. Jesus said that He would answer their prayers - 14:13

Jesus told the disciples to pray to the Father in His name

we are to pray in the name of Christ - John 16:26

we are to give thanks in the name of Christ - Eph. 5:20

we are to pray to the Father asking for His will to be done - Matt. 6:9-10

Jesus said that He would do what they asked

Jesus will answer what we ask as we abide in Him - John 15:7

Jesus will do the things that we ask according to His will - I John 5:14-15

Jesus said He would do this so the Father would be glorified in the Son

Jesus said that the Father is glorified in the Son - John 13:31

Jesus also said that the Son glorified the Father - John 17:1

Jesus was hated and rejected first in His own home town - Luke 4:29

b. Jesus said that He chose us out of the world - 15:19

Jesus said the world would treat its own a different way

the world takes pleasure in those who do evil - Rom. 1:32

Jesus said that the world loves its own

we used to be a part of those who hated - Titus 3:3

Jesus told His disciples that they were not of the world

our citizenship is in heaven as believers - Phil. 3:20

Jesus said that He chose them out of the world

Christ gave Himself to deliver us from this present evil age - Gal. 1:4

Jesus said that is why the world hated them

Jesus said they were hated because they were not of the world - John 17:14

we are to walk in the light as He is in the light - I John 1:7

b. Jesus told them the Jews would persecute them - 16:2

the Jews would put them out of the synagogues

the Jews took Stephen out of the synagogue to accuse him - Acts 6:10-15

the Jews would even kill them

Stephen became the first to die for Christ - Acts 7:54-60

the Jews would think they were serving God by killing them

the Jews brought great persecution against the church - Acts 8:1

Jesus said that He had spoken to the disciples about the Father
Jesus revealed the Father to the disciples - John 17:6
Jesus said He would continue to speak of the Father
Jesus said He would declare the name of the Father to the brethren - Heb. 2:12
Jesus prayed that the love of the Father would be in them
Jesus knew that the Father loved Him and He loved them - John 15:9
Jesus said that He would be in them
Jesus said He and the Father would live with them - John 14:23
Jesus said that the Holy Spirit would live in them - John 14:17
Jesus now lives in each believer - Gal. 2:20

VI. The Son of God and His ministry by death - 18:1-19:43

A. the ministry of Christ to Judas - 18:1-9

1. Judas brought a group of men to arrest Christ - 18:1-4

a. Jesus went to a garden with His disciples - 18:1

Jesus had spoken and prayed with the disciples
Jesus took His disciples with Him as He went
Jesus told them to pray to avoid temptation - Luke 22:40
Jesus then went and crossed the brook called Kidron
the brook had earlier served as the outer boundary of Jerusalem - I Kings 2:37
Jesus went to a garden on the other side of the brook
this garden was called the Garden of Gethsemane - Mark 14:32
Jesus entered the garden with His disciples
this garden was on the Mount of Olives - Luke 22:39

b. Jesus often went to this garden with His disciples - 18:2

Judas was the one who betrayed Christ
Judas had decided to do this for money - Luke 22:1-6
Judas knew where this garden was located
Judas had often gone there with Jesus and the other disciples
this was the custom of Jesus to go to this garden - Luke 22:39

c. Jesus knew that Judas was coming with a group of men - 18:3

Judas received a detachment of officers
this group of men was a large group - Matt. 26:47
Judas took the officers sent by the chief priests and Pharisees
Judas told them how he would betray Jesus - Matt. 26:48-49
Judas led them with their lanterns, torches and weapons

d. Jesus met the group and asked them who they were seeking - 18:4

Jesus knew all that was going to happen to Him
Jesus knew Judas would betray Him with a kiss - Luke 22:47-48
Jesus went out to meet this group of men
Jesus knew that His hour had come - John 13:1
Jesus asked them who they were seeking

2. Judas stood with the enemies of Christ - 18:5-9

a. Jesus was betrayed by Judas - 18:5

Jesus heard the men were looking for Him

Jesus knew exactly what Judas was doing - Matt. 26:46-48

Jesus told them He was Jesus

Jesus also saw Judas with them

Jesus had dismissed Judas to go and get these men - John 13:27

Jesus knew that Judas was betraying Him

Jesus still treated Judas as a friend - Matt. 26:50

b. Jesus caused the men to fall back when He spoke - 18:6

the officers heard that they were talking to Jesus

the officers went backward when Jesus spoke

the officers fell to the ground when Jesus spoke

Christ spoke with authority when he spoke - Matt. 7:28-29

c. Jesus asked them again who they were seeking - 18:7

Jesus asked them a question a second time

Jesus asked them who they were seeking

Jesus heard them say again they were seeking Jesus

the great concern of Jesus was to fulfill the Scriptures - Matt. 26:56

d. Jesus told them to let the disciples leave - 18:8

Jesus told them a second time that He was Jesus

Jesus knew He had come for this hour - John 12:27

Jesus said that He was the man they were seeking

Jesus told them they were fulfilling the prophets - Matt. 26:55-56

Jesus told them to let the disciples leave

the disciples quickly fled - Mark 14:50-52

e. Jesus was fulfilling a prophecy He had made - 18:9

Jesus was fulfilling His promise

Jesus had said only the son of perdition would be lost - John 17:12

Jesus had said that He would lose none

Jesus said it was the will of the Father that He lost none - John 6:39-40

B. the ministry of Christ to Malchus - 18:10-11

1. Malchus had his right ear cut off by Peter - 18:10

Peter had a sword and pulled it out
Peter swung the sword at the servant of the high priest
Peter cut off the right ear of the servant - Luke 22:50
Peter cut off the ear of the servant
Jesus showed His love by healing the ear - Luke 22:51
Peter did this to a servant named Malchus

2. Malchus had his ear healed by Christ - 18:11

Jesus told Peter to put away his sword
Jesus told Peter He did not need Peter to protect Him - Matt. 26:52-53
Jesus said He would drink the cup that the Father had given Him
Jesus had already settled this in the garden - Luke 22:42

C. the ministry of Christ to the religious leaders and Peter 18:12-27

1. Jesus was led away to Annas - 18:12-14

a. the band of men bound Jesus - 18:12

the band of men then took Jesus
the men then arrested Jesus - Luke 22:52-54
the band of men bound Jesus
they treated Christ as a criminal - John 18:24

b. the band of men took Christ to Annas - 18:13

the men took Jesus to Annas
Annas was the father-in-law of Caiaphas
Caiaphas was the high priest that year

c. the band of men were fulfilling the words of Caiaphas - 18:14

Caiaphas had already made his decision about Jesus
Caiaphas had given his decision to the religious leaders - John 12:49
Caiaphas said it was necessary for one man to die for the people
Caiaphas had already said that Jesus should die - John 12:50-53

2. Jesus is denied by Peter the first time - 18:15-18

a. Peter followed after Jesus - 18:15

Peter followed Jesus along with another disciple
Peter followed a long distance behind - Matt. 26:58
the other disciple knew the high priest
John never mentions his own name in John - John 13:23
the other disciple went into the courtyard of the high priest

b. Peter stood outside the door - 18:16

Peter stood outside the door of the courtyard
the other disciples had all fled - Mark 14:50
the other disciple then went back out the door
the other disciple spoke to the girl who was the doorkeeper
it was common to have a person at the gate of the courtyard - Acts 12:13-14
the other disciple brought Peter into the courtyard
Peter was able to come into the courtyard - Mark 14:66

c. Peter was asked if he followed Jesus by the doorkeeper - 18:17

the girl who was the doorkeeper asked Peter a question
Peter was questioned by the girl - Matt. 26:69
the girl asked Peter if he was also a disciple of Jesus
Peter claimed to have no knowledge of Christ - Mark 14:68
the girl heard Peter said that he was not
Peter was even fearful of a girl at this point - Matt. 26:70

d. Peter stood with those who were warming themselves - 18:18

the servants and officers were standing there
the officers remained in the courtyard - John 18:22
the servants had made a fire of coals
this had been done to warm themselves - Mark 14:67
the servants did this because it was cold
the Passover is close to the time of Easter - Acts 12:3-4
the servants and officers were warming themselves
Peter was with the servants and officers - Matt. 26:69
Peter then stood with them and also warmed himself
Peter eventually sat down among them - Luke 22:55

3. Jesus explains His teaching to the leaders - 18:19-23

a. Jesus was questioned about His teaching - 18:19

the high priest asked Jesus about His disciples
the high priest asked Jesus about His doctrine
Jesus had said His doctrine was from the Father - John 7:16

b. Jesus said that He had taught openly - 18:20

Jesus said that He taught openly in the world
Jesus had taught large crowds - Matt. 13:1-3
Jesus said that He taught in the synagogues
Jesus taught in the synagogues wherever He went - Matt. 4:23
Jesus said that He taught in the temple where many Jews were
Jesus had often taught in the temple - John 7:14
Jesus said that He had not taught anything in secret
the people had listened to Jesus teach many times - John 8:20

c. Jesus told them to ask those who heard Him - 18:21

Jesus asked them why they were questioning Him
they had stopped questioning Him publicly - Matt. 22:46
Jesus said they should ask those who had heard Him
the scribes and Pharisees had tried to trap Him many times - Luke 11:53-54
Jesus said those who heard should tell what they heard
the leaders had even questioned Jesus in the temple - John 10:23-24
Jesus said those who heard knew what He said
Jesus had taught them many times - John 5:17-47

d. Jesus was hit by one of the officers - 18:22

one of the officers struck Jesus with the palm of his hand
this action was against the law - Acts 23:2-3
one of the officers asked Him why He was talking to the high priest that way

e. Jesus asked the officer why He hit Him - 18:23

Jesus asked if He had spoken evil
Jesus said if so He should tell what evil
Jesus said if not why was He hit

4. Jesus is denied by Peter two more times - John 18:24-27

a. Annas sent Christ to Caiaphas - 18:24

Annas then sent him bound to Caiaphas

Annas was the one the Jews recognized as high priest - Acts 4:6

Annas did this because Caiaphas was the official high priest

Caiaphas had been appointed high priest by the Romans - John 11:49

Caiaphas and Annas served together as high priests - Luke 3:2

Caiaphas was the son-in-law of Annas - John 18:13-14

b. Peter denied Christ a second time - 18:25

Peter stood and warmed himself

Peter stood among those who were against Christ - Mark 14:73

Peter was asked a question by those around him

this question was also asked by a maid - Mark 14:69

Peter was asked if he was one of the disciples of Jesus

Peter was recognized as one of the disciples - Matt. 26:71

Peter denied that he was a disciple of Jesus

Peter said that he did not know the man - Matt. 26:72

c. Peter was recognized by one who saw him in the garden - 18:26

a servant of the high priest was there

this happened about an hour after the second denial - Luke 22:59

in this case his speech helped them recognize him - Matt. 26:73

this servant was a relative of the one whose ear Peter cut off

the one who lost his ear was also a servant of the high priest - Mark 14:47

this servant then asked Peter a question

Peter was not ready to admit he had been in the garden - John 18:10-11

this servant asked if he had seen Peter in the garden with Jesus

this servant had seen what Peter had done - John 18:10

d. Peter denied Christ a third time - 18:27

Peter denied Jesus for a third time

this fulfilled what Christ had said - John 13:36-38

immediately the rooster crowed

Peter then remembered what Jesus had said - Mark 14:72

Peter then went out and wept bitterly - Luke 22:60-62

D. the ministry of Christ to Pilate - 18:28-40

1. Jesus is brought to the hall of judgment - 18:28-32

a. Pilate sees Christ brought to the judgment hall - 18:28-29

the Jews brought Jesus to the judgment hall
this was where Pilate carried on official business - Matt. 27:1-2
the Jews would not go into the judgment hall
the Jews did not want to be defiled
they were totally defiled on the inside - Matt. 23:25-27; Luke 11:39
the Jews were planning to eat the Passover
Jesus had come to Jerusalem for the Passover - John 12:1
the Jews then saw Pilate come out to them
the Jews were controlling Pilate by fear - John 19:8
the Jews were asked what Jesus had done
the Jews made several false accusations - Luke 23:2

b. Pilate hears the Jews say Christ is an evildoer - 18:30

the Jews did not answer the question of Pilate
the Jews had no real accusation to bring against Jesus - Luke 23:3-4
the Jews said that Jesus was an evildoer
Pilate quickly found that Jesus was innocent - John 18:38
the Jews said that was why they brought Jesus to Pilate

c. Pilate hears the Jews ask for the death of Jesus - 18:31

the Jews are told that they should take Jesus
the Jews did not said they had a trial during the night - Matt. 26:57-75
the Jews were told to judge Jesus by their own law
the Jews had accused Jesus of blasphemy - John 10:33
the Jews said it was not lawful for them to put a person to death
the Jews had been planning His death for many months - John 11:53

d. Pilate did not know he was fulfilling the saying of Jesus - 18:32

Jesus had spoken about the way that He would die
Jesus told Nicodemus He would be lifted up - John 3:15-16
Jesus had said He would be lifted up
Jesus said He would be lifted up from the earth - John 12:32

2. Jesus is questioned by Pilate - 18:33-36

a. Pilate asked Jesus if He was the King of the Jews - 18:33

Pilate went back into the judgment hall
this was the Roman judgment hall - John 18:28
Pilate called Jesus and asked Him a question
Pilate asked if He was the King of the Jews
this was one of the accusations of the Jews - Luke 23:2-3

b. Pilate is asked if that was what others had told him - 18:34

Jesus asked him if this was his own question
Jesus was actually asking for witnesses - John 18:20-21
Jesus asked him if someone else gave him the question
Jesus knew that it was from the Jews - Luke 23:2-3

c. Pilate said that the Jews had delivered Jesus to him - 18:35

Pilate said that he was not a Jew
Pilate was the Roman governor - Matt. 27:11
Pilate said that His own nation had delivered Him
Pilate knew what motivated the multitude - Mark 15:8-9
Pilate said that the chief priests had delivered Him
Pilate knew they had delivered Jesus for envy - Mark 15:10
Pilate then asked Jesus what He had done
Pilate quickly realized that Christ should be released - 19:12

d. Pilate heard that the kingdom of Jesus was different - 18:36

Jesus said His kingdom was not of this world
His kingdom was not an earthly kingdom - John 6:15
His kingdom was not a part of the evil world system - Matt. 12:28
His kingdom was in the hearts of people - Matt. 6:33
Jesus said His servants would fight if it were
Jesus had prepared His followers for a spiritual battle - Eph. 6:10-17
Jesus said they would have kept him from being delivered to the Jews
Jesus knew that His hour to pay for sin had come - John 13:1
Jesus said that His kingdom was not an earthly kingdom
His kingdom will be established at the end of the age - Rev. 11:15; 20:4-6
His kingdom will then become an eternal kingdom - Is. 9:6-7; Luke 1:31-33

3. Jesus is declared innocent by Pilate - 18:37-40

a. Pilate asked Jesus if He was a king - 18:37

**Jesus was asked by Pilate if He was a king then
Jesus said that Pilate was right when he said Jesus was a king**
Jesus came to rule in our hearts and lives - Col. 3:15

Jesus said He was born to be a king
this was recognized at the time of His birth - Matt. 2:2-6

Jesus said this was the reason He came into the world
Jesus came from the Father to do His will - John 6:38-40

Jesus said He came to bear witness to the truth
grace and truth came by Jesus Christ - John 1:17

Jesus said that those who are of the truth hear Him
Jesus had said that His sheep heard His voice - John 10:27

b. Pilate asked the question, "What is truth?" - 18:38

Pilate asked Jesus, "What is truth?"

Jesus is the One who is the truth - John 14:6

Jesus said the truth will set a person free - John 8:32

Pilate went out again and spoke to the Jews

Pilate told the Jews he found no fault in Christ

Pilate would say this at least two more times - John 19:4, 19:6

c. Pilate told the Jews he would release Jesus - 18:39

Pilate said that the Jews had a custom

Pilate would release one prisoner at the Passover - Mark 15:6

Pilate said they could ask for a prisoner to be freed at Passover
the Jews began to ask for to do as he had done before - Mark 15:7-8

Pilate asked if he should release the King of the Jews
the chief priests got the people to ask for Barabbas - Mark 15:10-11

d. Pilate heard the Jews ask for Barabbas - 18:40

the Jews said that they did not want Jesus released
the Jewish leaders had been planning His death for months - John 11:53

the Jews said that they wanted Barabbas released

the Jews knew that Barabbas was a robber

Barabbas was also a terrorist - Mark 15:7

E. the ministry of Christ brings rejection - 19:1-15

1. Pilate told the Jews that he found no fault in Christ - 19:1-4

a. Jesus was ordered scourged by Pilate - 19:1

Pilate told the soldiers to take Christ

Pilate told the Jews he would chastise Jesus - Luke 23:16, 22
the soldiers took Jesus into the common hall - Matt. 27:27

Pilate had the soldiers scourge Christ

the soldiers gathered the whole band around Christ - Mark 15:16

b. Jesus was humiliated by the soldiers - 19:2

the soldiers made a crown of thorns

the soldiers fashioned this crown of thorns - Matt. 27:29

the soldiers put the crown of thorns on His head

the soldiers were preparing to mock Jesus - Mark 15:17

the soldiers put a purple robe on Jesus

the soldiers gave Jesus a purple robe - Mark 15:17

c. Jesus was mocked by the soldiers - 19:3

the soldiers then mocked Jesus

the soldiers began to salute Jesus - Mark 15:18

the soldiers called Him the King of the Jews

the soldiers bowed on their knee before Jesus - Matt. 27:29

the soldiers hit him with their hands

the soldiers also spit on Jesus - Matt. 27:30

the soldiers also hit Jesus on the head - Mark 15:19

d. Jesus is declared to be without fault to the Jews - 19:4

Pilate then went out and spoke to the Jews

Pilate seated himself on the judgment seat - Matt. 27:19

Pilate said that he was bringing Jesus out to them

Pilate's biggest concern was to please the people - Mark 15:15

Pilate wanted the Jews to know he found no fault in Jesus

Pilate had earlier said that he found no fault in Jesus - John 18:38

Pilate had then sent him to Herod - Luke 23:3-7

Pilate let the voices of the chief priests prevail - Luke 23:23

2. Pilate hears that Christ is the Son of God - 19:5-8

a. Jesus is presented to the Jews by Pilate - 19:5

Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns
the soldiers had made this crown of thorns - John 19:2
Jesus was wearing the purple robe
the soldiers put this robe on Him when they mocked Him - Mark 15:17-19
Pilate told the Jews, Behold the man

b. Jesus is declared to be without fault by Pilate - 19:6

the chief priests and officers saw Jesus
these were the men who persuaded the people - Matt. 27:20
the chief priest called Pilate to crucify Jesus
the chief priests asked Pilate to crucify Christ - Matt. 27:22
Pilate said at first you take Him
Pilate tried to wash his hands of the whole event - Matt. 27:24
Pilate said at first you crucify Him
Pilate actually wanted to release Jesus - John 19:12
Pilate said again He found no fault in Jesus
Pilate said this for the third time - John 18:38; 19:4

c. Jesus is condemned by the Jews - 19:7

the Jews said that they had a law
this statement was based on the Old Testament - Lev. 24:16
the Jews had asked Jesus if He was the Son of God - Matt. 26:63
the Jews said that their law demanded the death penalty
the Jews had accused Jesus of blasphemy - Matt. 26:64-66
the Jews said Jesus had made Himself the Son of God
the Jews rejected the fact that Jesus is God - John 10:30-33
the Jews were willing to have the blood of Jesus on them - Matt. 27:25

d. Jesus saw Pilate become more and more afraid - 19:8

Pilate heard what the Jews said about Jesus
Pilate had heard what Jesus, Himself, had said - John 18:37
Pilate became even more afraid
Pilate was controlled by fear - John 19:12-13
Pilate was willing to satisfy the people because of fear - Mark 15:15

3. Pilate seeks to release Christ - 19:9-12

a. Pilate asks Jesus a question but gets no answer - 19:9

Pilate went back into the judgment hall

Pilate had come out of the judgment hall to please the Jews - John 18:28

Pilate again questioned Jesus

Pilate had earlier questioned Jesus - John 18:33-38

Pilate asked Jesus where He had come from

Jesus had said His kingdom was not from this world - John 18:36

Pilate did not receive an answer from Jesus

b. Pilate says that he has power to crucify Christ - 19:10

Pilate asked, "Are You not speaking to me?"

Pilate marveled at the silence of Jesus - Matt. 27:14

Pilate said that he had power to crucify Jesus

Pilate was helpless in himself - Matt. 27:19-25

Pilate said that he had power to release Jesus

Pilate was intimidated by the Jews - Luke 23:21-24

c. Pilate is told that all power comes from God - 19:11

Pilate heard that he had no power in himself against Jesus

Christ could have called twelve legions of angels - Matt. 26:53

Pilate heard that any power he had must come from above

Jesus is the One who is from above - John 8:23

Pilate heard that those who delivered Jesus had the greater sin

Caiaphas had let the plot to destroy Jesus - John 11:49-53

Caiaphas had delivered Jesus to Pilate - John 18:35

d. Pilate then wanted to release Jesus - 19:12

Pilate wanted to release Jesus from that time

Pilate was controlled by fear - John 19:8

Pilate listened to what the Jews cried out

Pilate was being shouted down by the Jews - Matt. 27:22-23

the Jews told Pilate he was not Caesar's friend if he let Jesus go

Pilate had earlier tried to shift the responsibility to Herod - Luke 23:6-7

the Jews said one who makes himself a king speaks against Caesar

the Jews used the name of Caesar for their own benefit - John 19:15

4. Pilate hears the Jews reject Christ as their king - 19:13-15

a. Pilate takes his place on the judgment seat - 19:13

Pilate heard what the Jews had said
the people were using the fear of Pilate - John 19:8; 12
Pilate then brought Jesus out to them again
he had already brought Jesus out once - John 19:5
Pilate then sat down in the judgment seat
this was where Pilate gave official judgments - Matt. 27:19
this place was called the Pavement
(this was an area paved with stones)
the place was called Gabbatha in Hebrew

b. Pilate presents Christ as their king - 19:14

it was the time to prepare for the Passover
this was about the time they killed the Passover lamb
because this was the preparation day - John 19:31; 19:42
it was about the sixth hour (6 a.m)
John used Roman time, Mark used Jewish time - Mark 15:25

c. Pilate hears the Jews choose Caesar over Christ - 19:15

the Jews then began to cry out to Pilate
the Jews wanted Christ crucified - Mark 15:13-14
they said to do away with Christ
the chief priests wanted to destroy Jesus - Matt. 27:20
they said to crucify Christ
the Jews said let Him be crucified - Matt. 27:22-23
they were encouraged to do this by the chief priests - Matt. 27:20
Pilate asked if he should crucify their King
the Jews rejected Jesus as King - Mark 15:12-13
Pilate had given them a choice of who to release - Matt. 27:17
Pilate listened to them and released Barabbas - Mark 15:15
Pilate knew that the real problem was envy - Matt. 27:18
the chief priests gave a reply to Pilate
the Jews did not even want a sign calling Jesus a King - John 19:21-22
the chief priest said they had no king but Caesar
the Jews had already said he was not a friend of Caesar - John 19:12
Pilate was trying to just please the Jews - Matt. 27:24-25

F. the ministry of Christ in His crucifixion - 19:16-30

1. Jesus is delivered to be crucified - 19:16-18

a. Jesus was delivered for crucifixion - 19:16

Pilate then gave the order

Pilate gave the official order - Matt. 27:26

Pilate delivered Jesus to the will of the chief priests - Luke 23:25

Pilate said that Christ should be crucified

Pilate delivered Jesus to be crucified - Mark 15:15

the soldiers then took Jesus

the soldiers first humiliated Jesus - Matt. 27:30

they even mocked Him by bowing to Him - Mark 15:19

the soldiers led Jesus away

Jesus was led away by the soldiers - Luke 23:26

b. Jesus was taken to Golgotha - 19:17

Jesus was forced to carry His cross

they later made a man of Cyrene carry it - Matt. 27:31

this man was named Simon - Luke 23:26

Simon had two sons named Alexander and Rufus - Mark 15:21

Christ was taken to a place called the place of a skull

this place was called Calvary (a skull) - Luke 23:33

this is how that place got its name - Matt. 27:32

that place was called Golgotha in the Hebrew

Golgotha means the place of the skull - Mark 15:22

c. Jesus was crucified between two men - 19:18

the soldiers crucified Jesus

they were just carrying out their job - Mark 15:22-24

the soldiers also crucified two other men

these two other men were criminals - Luke 23:32

the two other men were placed on the two sides

one man was on the right hand and the other on the left - Luke 23:33

one of the men would reject Christ - Luke 23:39

one of the men would later repent - Luke 23:40-43

Jesus was placed in the middle

Isaiah had said He would die with the wicked - Is. 53:9

2. Jesus is called the King of the Jews by Pilate - 19:19-22

a. Pilate put a title on the cross - 19:19

Pilate wrote a title
Pilate put the title on the cross
this title was placed over His head - Matt. 27:37
Pilate wrote the following title
JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS

b. Pilate wrote the title in three languages - 19:20

the title was read by many of the Jews
many of these were the ones that wanted Jesus killed - Matt. 27:39-43
the place of the crucifixion was near the city
the title was written in Hebrew
this was the language of the Jews
the title was written in Greek
this was the language of most Gentiles
the title was written in Latin
this was the official language of the Romans

c. Pilate was asked to change the title - 19:21

the chief priests spoke to Pilate
the chief priests were there mocking Jesus - Matt. 27:41
the chief priests told Pilate to change the title
the chief priests were continuing their rejection - John 19:15
the chief priests told him not to write "The King of the Jews"
Pilate recognized that Jews was a King - John 18:33-37
Pilate also knew Jesus was the son of God - John 19:7-8
the chief priests told him to write the following title
"He said, I am the King of the Jews"

d. Pilate refused to change the title - 19:22

Pilate said he would not change the title
this was his way of getting even with the Jews - John 19:12
Pilate said he would leave what he had written
Pilate knew that he had lost control - Mark 15:15
Pilate was now trying to show he was in charge - Matt. 27:18-24

3. Jesus provides for the care of His mother - John 19:23-27

a. Christ sees His clothing divided by the soldiers - 19:23-24

the soldiers then crucified Christ

the soldiers did that at the third hour (9 am) - Mark 15:25

these soldiers were just doing their job - Luke 23:32-33

these soldiers would be there until Jesus died - John 19:33-34

the soldiers divided His garments into four parts

this would indicate four soldiers were there

the soldiers each took a part

the soldiers did this as they sat and watched Jesus - Matt. 27:36

the soldiers saw that His coat was woven without a seam

they fulfilled prophecy because His coat (vesture) was worth more - Matt. 27:35

the soldiers decided to cast lots for His coat

the soldiers cast lots to see what each took - Mark 15:24

the soldiers fulfilled an Old Testament prophecy

the soldier did not know they were fulfilling prophecy

this was prophesied by David in Psalm 22:18

the prophecy said, "They divided my garments among them"

the soldiers divided the garments among themselves - Matt. 27:35

the prophecy said, "And for My clothing they cast lots"

they cast lots to see what each man would take - Mark 15:24

b. Christ sees the women standing by the cross - 19:25

Jesus saw His mother standing by the cross

Mary was seeing the prophecy of Simeon fulfilled - Luke 2:35

Jesus saw the sister of His mother standing by the cross

this was possibly the woman named Salome - Mark 15:40

Jesus saw other women standing by the cross

these women had followed Jesus to the cross - Luke 23:27

c. Christ gives John the responsibility for His mother - 19:26

Jesus took His responsibility to provide for His mother

Jesus took the responsibility of a son - I Tim. 5:4

Jesus saw the disciples He loved standing by the cross

John referred to himself as the disciples Jesus loved - John 13:23

Jesus told His mother that John was take care of her

John immediately took that responsibility - John 19:27

d. Christ sees John begin to take care of His mother - 19:27

Jesus spoke to the disciple that He loved
John referred to himself by this title - John 13:23
Jesus told that disciple to care for His mother
this disciple took the responsibility for His mother

4. Jesus fulfills Scripture and dies - 19:28-30

a. Jesus finishing fulfilling the Scriptures - 19:28

Jesus know that all things had been accomplished
Jesus had been forsaken by the Father - Mark 15:34
Jesus had offered Himself for sin - Heb. 10:12
Jesus knew there was another Scripture to fulfill
Jesus was fulfilling each of the Scriptures - Matt. 26:54
Jesus then said, "I thirst"
this was a fulfillment of Psalm 22:15

b. Jesus was given vinegar by those standing by - 19:29

there was a container of vinegar sitting there
Jesus had rejected the wine and myrrh given to deaden pain - Matt. 27:34
those standing by filled a sponge with vinegar
they put the sponge on a stick of hyssop
hyssop was a small plant - Ex. 12:22
they then put the sponge to his mouth

c. Jesus finished His payment for sin - 19:30

Jesus received the vinegar
this was to prolong the suffering - Mark 15:36
Jesus then spoke to those around the cross
Jesus spoke with a loud cry - Mark 15:37
Jesus said, "It is finished"
Jesus came to finish the work the Father gave Him - John 4:34
Jesus then bowed His head
Jesus had finished the work of the Father - John 17:4
Jesus then gave up His spirit
Jesus still had strength to cry with a loud voice - Matt. 27:50
Jesus commended His spirit to Father - Luke 23:46

G. the ministry of Christ in His death and burial - 19:31-42

1. Jesus was pronounced dead by the soldiers - 19:31-34

a. the Jews wanted the legs broken so the men would die - 19:31

it was the preparation day for the Passover
the Jews did not want to defile themselves - John 18:28
the Jews did not want the bodies left on the crosses on the Sabbath
the law said one hanged on a tree should be buried that day - Deut. 21:22-23
a person was considered cursed if they hung on a tree - Gal. 3:13
the Jews felt this Sabbath day was a high day
the Jews wanted the bodies removed before the Sabbath - Mark 5:42
the Jews asked for the legs of the men to be broken
(the Romans normally let people on crosses for several days)
the Jews knew that the bodies could then be taken down
(this would bring immediate death from lack of air)

b. the soldiers broke the legs of the other men - 19:32

the soldiers then came to break the legs of the men
this was at the request of the Jews - John 19:31
the soldiers broke the legs of the first criminal
the soldiers broke the legs of the second criminal

c. the soldiers saw that Christ was already dead - 19:33

the soldiers then came to Jesus
Jesus had finished what He was sent to do - John 19:30
the soldiers saw that Jesus was dead already
Jesus had already given up His spirit - Matt. 27:50-53
the soldiers did not break the legs of Jesus

d. one soldier pierced the side of Jesus - 19:34

one soldier then took his spear
the soldiers were fulfilling the Old Testament - Zech. 12:10
that soldier pierced the side of Jesus
Jesus showed the disciples His side - John 20:20
this caused blood and water to come from the side
(blood separates after the body is dead)

2. Jesus fulfilled the Scriptures in His death - 19:35-37

a. John saw Jesus die and saw His side pieced - 19:35

John saw the soldier pierce the side
Jesus invited Thomas to reach into this hole - John 20:27
John knew that his witness was true
John knew that what he said was true
John had seen this with his own eyes - I John 1:1-2
John said this so that we could believe
this is the purpose of the book of John - John 20:30-31

b. this fulfilled the Scripture that His bones would not be broken - 19:36

the piercing was done to fulfill the Scripture
Jesus was concerned to fulfill the Scriptures - Matt. 26:54
the piercing was done to fulfill a prophecy
this prophecy was given in Ex 12:46 and Num. 9:12

c. this fulfilled the Scripture that He would be pierced - 19:37

this piercing also fulfilled another Scripture
Jesus knew and fulfilled each Old Testament Scripture - John 19:28
that Scripture said they would look on Him that was pierced
this prophecy was quoted from Zech. 12:10

3. Jesus was buried in a new sepulcher - 19:38-42

a. Joseph asked for permission to bury Jesus 19:38

Joseph was from the city of Arimathaea
Joseph had not agreed to put Jesus to death - Luke 23:51
Joseph was a disciple of Jesus
Joseph was waiting for the kingdom of God - Mark 15:43
Joseph had been a secret disciple because he feared the Jews
the Jews had already put people out of the synagogue - John 9:22, 9:33-35
Joseph asked Pilate if he could take the body of Jesus
Pilate sent a centurion to make sure Jesus was dead - Mark 15:44
Joseph was given permission by Pilate
Pilate then gave permission for Joseph to take the body - Mark 15:45
Joseph went and took down the body of Jesus from the cross

b. Joseph was assisted by Nicodemus in burying Jesus - 19:39

Nicodemus came and helped Joseph

Joseph had made the arrangements with Pilate - Matt. 27:57-58

Nicodemus had originally come to Jesus by night

Nicodemus was one Pharisee who was searching for life - John 3:1-2

Nicodemus and Joseph brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes

this was one of the gifts brought to Christ after His birth - Matt. 2:11

this was done to keep down the smell - John 11:39

Nicodemus and Joseph brought about one hundred pounds of the mixture

the women brought more spices the day of His resurrection - Luke 24:1

c. Joseph and Nicodemus prepared the body with spices - 19:40

they took the body of Jesus

they took the body down from the cross - Luke 23:53

they wound the body in linen clothes

the linen that they brought was fine linen - Mark 15:46

they would wrap each part of the body - John 11:44

they placed the spices in the linen clothes

they wrapped the body with these linen clothes - Matt. 27:59

they buried Jesus the ordinary Jewish way

this was done with simplicity and very quickly - Luke 23:53-54

d. Joseph and Nicodemus took the body to a garden - 19:41

the place where Jesus was crucified was near a garden

this was Joseph's tomb for his future burial - Matt. 27:60

there was a new sepulcher in the garden

this sepulcher had been hewn out of the rock - Mark 15:46

no one had ever been buried in this sepulcher

this was a new tomb that had not been used - Luke 23:53

e. Joseph and Nicodemus laid the body in a new tomb - 19:42

they laid the body of Jesus in this sepulcher

they then rolled a stone across the entrance - Mark 15:46

they did this because it was the Jews' preparation day

this was the day before the Sabbath - Mark 15:42

they did this because it was close to the place of the cross

they barely finished before the Sabbath began - Luke 23:54

VII. The Son of God and His resurrection ministry - 20:1-21-25

A. the ministry of Christ to Mary Magdalene - 20:1-18

1. Mary was the first to report that the tomb was empty - 20:1-5

a. Mary saw the stone had been rolled away from the tomb - 20:1

Mary came early on the first day of the week
some other women came with Mary bringing spices - Mark 16:1
Mary came while it was still dark
Mary and the others got there just as the sun was rising - Mark 16:2
Mary came to the sepulcher
Mary saw that the stone had been rolled away
the women were discussing who would roll away the stone - Mark 16:3-4

b. Mary quickly went and told Peter and John - 20:2

Mary ran and told Peter
Mary was told to go tell Peter - Mark 16:7
Mary also told the disciple that Jesus loved
Mary said that the body of the Lord had been taken from the tomb
Mary said she did not know where they body had been taken

c. Mary saw Peter and John run quickly toward the tomb - 20:3-5

1) John and Peter both went to see - 20:3

2) John was the first to reach the tomb- 20:4

John and Peter ran together
Peter and John both ran to the grave - Luke 24:12
John outran Peter as they ran
John got to the sepulcher first

3. John did not go into the tomb at first - 20:5

John stooped down and looked in
John say the linen clothes lying there
this caused John to believe - John 20:8
John did not go into the tomb

2. Mary had her message verified by Peter and John - 20:6-10

a. Peter saw the graveclothes and the linen napkin - 20:6-7

Peter arrived at the tomb as he caught up with John

Peter and John had both been told by Mary - John 20:2-3
Mary had been told to tell the disciples and Peter - Mark 16:7

Peter went right into the sepulcher

Peter had always been a man of action - Matt. 17:3-4
Peter often acted without much thought - John 13:8-9

Peter saw the linen clothes lying there

this is in contrast to when Lazarus came forth - John 11:44

Peter saw the cloth that had been around His head

this caused Peter to wonder - Luke 24:12

Peter saw the cloth folded and lying by itself

(this meant Christ had not left in a hurry)

b. Peter was joined in the tomb by John - 20:8

John joined Peter in the tomb

(they both saw the graveclothes and napkin)

John had been the first to arrive at the tomb

John had outrun Peter on the way to the tomb - 20:3

John saw the things in the tomb and believed

John wrote this book so that we would believe - John 20:30-31

c. Peter and John did not yet understand the Scripture - 20:9

Peter and John did not understand the Scripture

Jesus opened their understanding that night - Luke 24:45

Peter and John did not yet know it taught the resurrection

Jesus showed that the Scriptures taught the death and resurrection - Luke 24:46-47

Peter learned quickly how to teach the death and resurrection - Acts 2:14-40

d. Peter and John then returned home - 20:10

the disciples then left the tomb

the Lord appeared to Peter sometime during the day - Luke 24:34

the disciples went to their own home

John apparently had a home in Jerusalem - John 19:27

the Lord appeared to ten of them that evening - John 20:19

3. Mary returned to the tomb and wept - 20:11-14

a. Mary cried as she looked into the tomb - 20:11

Mary stood outside the sepulcher weeping
the women had gone into the tomb earlier - Luke 24:3
Mary bent down as she was weeping
Mary looked into the sepulcher as she was weeping
she did not go in this time as she earlier - Mark 16:5

b. Mary saw two angels sitting in the tomb - 20:12

Mary saw two angels sitting in white
an angel had spoken to the women earlier - Matt. 28:5
Mary saw one angel at the head
that angel had been sitting on the right side - Mark 16:5
Mary saw one angel at the feet
that angel had shown where Jesus had laid - Mark 16:6
Mary saw they were sitting where Jesus had lain
Mary was asked questions by the angels - Luke 24:4-5

c. Mary was asked why she was weeping - 20:13

Mary was asked a question by the angels
Mary and the others had been asked a question earlier - Luke 24:5
Mary was asked why she was weeping
Mary and the other women were all filled with sorrow- Luke 23:37
Mary said she was weeping because they had taken away the Lord
Mary and the other women had been told that Jesus had risen - Luke 24:5-8
Mary said she did not know where they had taken the body
Mary was having a difficult time understanding even what she said - Luke 24:11

d. Mary then turned away from the tomb - 20:14

Mary finished speaking to the angels
Mary then turned around
Mary saw someone standing there
her eyes were filled with tears - 20:11
Mary had not yet realized this was the Lord - John 20:16
Mary did not realize that it was Jesus
she only realized when Jesus called her name - 20:16

4. Mary was the first to see Jesus after the resurrection - 20:15-18

a. Mary was asked why she was weeping - 20:15

Mary was asked two questions
Mary was asked again why she was weeping
Mary was asked who she was seeking
Mary had been told Jesus had risen - Luke 24:6
Mary thought it must be the gardener
Jesus revealed Himself in His timing - Luke 24:16; 31
Mary asked where he had laid the body
Mary said that she would take the body away

b. Mary recognized Jesus when He called her name- 20:16

Mary then heard Jesus call her name
Mary loved Jesus and recognized His voice - John 12:1-8
Mary then turned and really looked
Mary recognized that it was Jesus
Mary instantly had her sorrow turned to joy - John 20:11
Mary then called Him Rabboni which means Master
Mary really treated Christ as her Master - Matt. 26:6-13

c. Mary was told not to hold onto Jesus - 20:17

Jesus told her not to hold onto Him
Mary would later learn to depend on the Holy Spirit - Acts 1:14; 2:1
Jesus said He had not yet ascended to His Father
Jesus led captivity captive when He ascended - Eph. 4:8
Mary was told to go tell His brethren
this is a new relationship between Christ and the disciples - John 15:15
Mary was to say Christ had ascended to her Father and their Father
Jesus is the One who has ascended above all things - Eph. 4:9-10
Mary was to say Christ had ascended to her God and their God

d. Mary went and told the disciples she had seen the Lord - 20:18

Mary told the disciples she had seen the Lord
Mary was the first to see Christ after the resurrection - Mark 16:9
Mary told the disciples what He had said to her
Mary told the disciples what Jesus said - Mark 16:10

B. the ministry of Christ to the ten - 20:19-23

1. Jesus came and appeared to the disciples - 20:19

Jesus came that evening which was the first day of the week
Jesus came into the room even though the doors were shut
Jesus came and stood in the middle - Luke 24:36
Jesus knew the doors were shut because of the fear of the disciples
Jesus stood in the middle of the disciples
Jesus told the disciples to have peace
they were terrified at first - Luke 24:37

2. Jesus showed the disciples His hands and His side - 20:20

Jesus showed the disciples His hands
Jesus had them observe His hands and His feet - Luke 24:39-40
Jesus showed the disciples His feet
Jesus saw their fear turn to gladness
they were immediately filled with joy - Luke 24:41
Jesus saw this response when they saw Him

3. Jesus said He was now sending the disciples as the Father sent Him - 20:21

Jesus spoke to the disciples again
Jesus told them to have peace
Jesus said that the Father had sent Him
Jesus said that He was now sending them
Jesus sent them to "Make Disciples" - Matt. 28:18-20

4. Jesus told the disciples to receive the Holy Spirit - 20:22

Jesus breathed on the disciples
Jesus then spoke to the disciples
Jesus told them to receive the Holy Spirit
this happened on the Day of Pentecost - Acts 2:1-4

5. Jesus told them how to minister to others - 20:23

Jesus said when they remitted sins they were remitted
we share the message of forgiveness by Christ - Rom. 10:13
Jesus said when they retained sins they were retained

C. the ministry of Christ to Thomas - 20:24-31

1. John said Thomas did not believe that Jesus had risen - 20:24-25

a. Thomas was not present that night - 20:24

Thomas was one of the twelve
Thomas was one of the apostles - Luke 6:13-16
Thomas was called Didymus
Thomas was not there when Jesus came

b. Thomas said he did not believe Jesus was alive - 20:25

Thomas was told by the other disciples that they had seen the Lord
Thomas said he had to put his finger in the holes in His hands
Jesus had showed the disciples His hands and His feet - Luke 24:40
Thomas said he had to put his hand in the hole in His side
this was where the soldier pierced Jesus - John 19:34
Thomas said that otherwise he would not believe
Christ changed the doubts to belief - John 10:28

2. John said Thomas was invited to believe by Jesus - 20:26-27

a. Thomas lived with his unbelief for a whole week - 20:26

the disciples were gathered together again a week later
the disciples had Thomas with them this time
the disciples saw Jesus stand in the middle even with the doors shut
this was the way Christ had come the previous week - John 20:19
the disciples heard Jesus tell them to have peace
this had also been His message earlier - Luke 24:36

b. Thomas was told by Jesus to believe - 20:27

Jesus told Thomas to put his finger in the hole in His hand
Jesus told Thomas to put his hand in the hole in His side
this had been the request of Thomas one week earlier - John 20:25
Jesus told Thomas not to be faithless
Jesus wants people to believe by faith - John 20:29
Jesus told Thomas to believe
Jesus had rebuked the disciples for their unbelief - Mark 16:14

3. John said Thomas believed and was changed - 20:28-29

a. Thomas recognized Christ as his Lord - 20:28

Thomas recognized Christ as his Lord
this was what Saul later recognized - Acts 9:6
Thomas recognized Christ as his God
Jesus had told Mary He was ascending to their God - John 20:17

b. Thomas heard those who believed without seeing were blessed - 20:29

Jesus said Thomas believed because he had seen Jesus
Thomas had said that he had to see to believe - John 20:25
Jesus said that there were also those who had not seen Him
we believe because of the testimony of the apostles - I John 1:1-3
Jesus said they were blessed because they believed
Jesus was continually inviting people to believe - John 3:15-18
Jesus wants us to believe in Him by faith - Rom. 10:9-10
Jesus wants us to walk by faith - II Cor. 5:7

4. John tells the purpose of the book of John - 20:30-31

a. John said Jesus did many other signs - 20:30

Jesus also did many other signs
there were too many signs to be written - John 21:25
Jesus did those signs in the presence of His disciples
others often did not know how the miracles happened - John 9:7
Jesus did not lead John to write those signs in this book
(each sign recorded showed the power of Christ in a different way)

b. John told why these signs were written - 20:31

these particular signs are written for a purpose
these signs are to cause us to believe - Luke 1:4
these signs were written to cause us to believe Jesus is Christ
some signs were to cause the disciples to believe - John 2:12
these signs were written to cause us to believe Jesus is the Son of God
Jesus and the Father are One - John 10:30
these signs are written so that we can have life through His name
Jesus came to give life - John 10:10

D. the ministry of Christ to Peter - 21:1-17

1. Peter and several others go fishing - 21:1-4

a. Peter and some other disciples saw Jesus at the Sea of Tiberius - 21:1

Jesus appeared again to the disciples

He had appeared the day He arose - John 20:19

He had appeared again a week later - John 20:26

Jesus appeared this time at the Sea of Tiberius

this is another name for the Sea of Galilee - John 6:1

(this meant the disciples had traveled to Galilee)

Jesus had said for the disciples to go to Galilee - Matt. 28:7

Jesus appeared in a different place to the disciples

Jesus made several appearances after the resurrection - I Cor. 15:5-8

b. Peter and several other disciples were gathered together - 21:2

Peter was with several of the other disciples

the disciples were not always in one place - John 20:24

Peter was with a total of six other disciples

several were former fishermen - Mark 1:16-20

c. Peter said that he was going fishing - 21:3

Peter said that he was going to go fishing

Peter may have felt that he had failed Jesus - Luke 22:60-62

Peter had to learn to apply what Jesus had said - Luke 22:31-32

Peter heard the other six say they were going with him

the other disciples may have also felt they failed - Mark 14:50

Peter and the others immediately went and got into a boat

their boats had been left with family members - Mark 1:14

Peter and the others fished all night and caught nothing

Peter had the same thing happen when Jesus first called him - Luke 5:5-8

d. Peter and the others did not recognize Jesus in the morning - 21:4

Jesus came and stood on the shore in the morning

Jesus had originally called the disciples in the same area - Matt. 4:18-22

Jesus was not recognized by the disciples

other disciples had also had this happen - Luke 24:16

2. Peter decided to swim to Christ - 21:5-9

a. Jesus asked the disciples if they had any food - 21:5

Jesus asked the disciples if they had any food
Jesus was told by the disciples that they had no food

b. Jesus told them to put their net on the right side - 21:6

Jesus told them to cast the net on the right side of the boat
Jesus had done a similar thing when He first called the disciples - Luke 5:4-6

Jesus told them that they would get a catch of fish
Jesus was showing them the importance of obedience to Him - John 15:14

Jesus watched as the disciples obeyed
Peter had questioned the first time - Luke 5:5

Jesus watched as the disciples got a net full of fish
the disciples were learning that Christ would supply - Phil. 4:19

c. Jesus was recognized by the disciples - 21:7

Peter was told by John that it was Jesus
John was close to Jesus and was the first to recognize Jesus - John 13:23

Peter put on his fisher's coat
Peter had previously taken off his fisher's coat
Peter jumped into the sea and swam to shore
Peter was anxious to be with Jesus - John 13:36-38

d. Jesus saw the disciples bring the fish to land - 21:8

the other disciples came in the little boat
the other disciples were not far from the land
the other disciples were only about 300 feet from land
the other disciples came dragging the net full of fish

e. Jesus had prepared breakfast for the disciples - 21:9

the disciples came to the land
the disciples saw that there was a fire already built
Jesus was again teaching the disciples by serving them - John 13:15-17
the disciples saw that there were fish on the fire
the disciples also saw that there was bread

3. Peter saw the Lord supply their needs - 21:10-14

a. Jesus told them to bring the fish that they had caught - 21:10

**Jesus spoke to the disciples
Jesus told them to bring the fish that they had caught**

b. Jesus had them count the fish they had caught - 21:11

**Peter went to the boat
Peter pulled the net to the land
Peter saw that the net was full of fish
Peter found out that there were 153 fish
Peter saw that the net had not been broken**

c. Jesus invited the disciples to eat - 21:12

the disciples were invited to come and eat
Christ was showing them that He met needs - Luke 9:12-13
the disciples did not ask any questions
the disciples had grown in their understanding - Luke 24:45
the disciples knew that it was the Lord
they had earlier recognized the Lord - John 20:20

d. Jesus served them the food that He had prepared - 21:13

Jesus then went to the food
Jesus was showing the disciples how to serve one another - John 13:4-5
Jesus served the bread to the disciples
Jesus served the fish to the disciples
Jesus had prepared these fish over the fire - John 21:9

e. Jesus was making a third appearance to the disciples - 21:14

Jesus was making His third appearance to the disciples
the first appearance was the night of the resurrection - John 20:10
the second appearance was one week later - John 20:26
Jesus was showing Himself to the disciples
Jesus was providing infallible proof of His resurrection - Acts 1:3
Jesus was proving that He was risen from the dead
the disciples were to be witnesses of the resurrection - Acts 1:22

4. Peter was restored to ministry by Christ - 21:15-17

a. Jesus asked Peter if Peter loved Him more than the fish - 21:15

Jesus waited until they had finished eating
Jesus then turned to Peter and questioned him
Jesus asked Peter if Peter loved Him with total love
Jesus used the word for total commitment (agapao) - John 3:16
Jesus asked Peter if Peter loved Him more than the fish
Peter had returned to fishing - John 21:1
Peter probably felt like a failure - Luke 22:31-34, 22:54-62
Jesus heard the answer of Peter
Peter was afraid to express total commitment - John 13:36-38
Jesus heard Peter say that he loved Jesus
Peter used the word for family love (phileo) - John 11:36
Jesus told Peter to feed Christ's lambs
Peter learned to feed new Christians - I Pet. 2:2

b. Jesus asked Peter the same question a second time - 21:16

Peter asked Peter if he love Jesus with total love
Jesus used the word for total commitment (agapao) again - I John 4:10
Peter said that he loved the Lord
Peter used the word for family love (phileo) again - Matt. 10:37
Peter said Jesus knew that he loved Jesus
Peter was afraid to speak of his love because of fear - I John 4:18
Peter was told to shepherd Christ's sheep
Peter learned to minister as a shepherd - I Pet. 5:1-4

c. Jesus asked Peter the same question a third time - 21:17

Peter was questioned a third time
Peter was asked if he loved Jesus
Jesus used the word for family love (phileo) this time - John 11:3
Peter was grieved because Jesus asked him three times
he had earlier wept bitterly about his feeling of failure - Luke 22:62
Peter told Jesus that Jesus knew all things
Peter said that Jesus knew that Peter loved Him
Peter knew he had not shown total commitment by denying Christ - Luke 22:60-62
Peter was told to feed Christ's sheep
Jesus restored Peter to ministry a third time - Luke 22:31-34

E. the ministry of Christ summarized - 21:18-25

1. Peter was told how he would die - 21:18-19

a. Jesus told Peter what would happen when he was old - 21:18

Peter clothed himself when he was young
Peter went where he wanted to go when he was young
Peter did what he wanted to do - Matt. 14:27-29
Peter would not be in control when he was old
Peter was nearly killed a few years later - Acts 12:1-5
Peter would have others cloth him when he was old
Peter would have others lead him when he was old
(tradition says that Peter was crucified when he was old)

b. Jesus was speaking of the way Peter would die - 21:19

Jesus was speaking of the way Peter's death would glorify God
God can use the way people die to bring glory to God - John 11:15
Jesus spoke to Peter and told him to follow Him
Jesus repeated an invitation given to Peter earlier - Matt. 4:18-19

2. Peter asked how John would die - 21:20-24

a. John was also following - 21:20

Peter then turned and looked around
Peter wanted to know what would happen to the other disciples - John 21:21
Peter saw the disciple that Jesus loved
this was the title John used for himself - John 13:23
Peter had been there when that disciple leaned on Jesus' breast
John had been next to Jesus at the last supper - John 13:23
Peter had John ask who would betray Jesus
Peter had motioned for John to ask - John 13:24-25

b. John heard Peter ask what would happen to John - 21:21

Peter saw John standing near Jesus
John was often close to Jesus - John 19:26-27
Peter asked what would happen to John
Jesus wanted Peter to just focus on Him - John 21:22

c. John heard as Peter was told to follow Christ - 21:22

Jesus told Peter that Christ decided what would happen to John

Peter was to focus on what Christ called him to do - John 21:15-17

Jesus said He could even will that John would live until He came back

John made it clear he knew this would not happen - John 21:23

Jesus told Peter that Peter was to be obedient and follow Him

Peter later taught we are to follow Jesus' steps - I Pet. 2:21

d. John realized some thought he would not die - 21:23

this caused the brethren to start a rumor

this caused the brethren to think that John would not die

John did write Revelation at an old age - Rev. 1:1-3, 1:9

this was due to the fact that they did not understand Jesus
the disciples did not always understand and believe - Luke 24:11

Jesus had said what happened to John was in His will

John had seen that Jesus did the will of His Father - John 6:38

e. John knew that His testimony about Jesus was true - 21:24

John was the one who gave witness of these things

John was a witness that studied Christ closely - I John 1:1-2

John was the one who wrote these things

John had been with Christ observing Him - John 1:37

John knew that his own testimony was true

John had seen and believed - John 20:8

3. many more books could be written about Jesus - 21:25

Jesus also did many other things

Jesus performed many other signs - John 20:30

Jesus did many things that were not written down

the things that were written were to cause us to believe - John 20:31

Jesus did more than could be written down

Jesus did so much the world could not contain the books

(the four Gospels tell us just a little of what Jesus did)

Matthew showed that Jesus had the right to be the King - Matt. 1:1-17

Mark showed that Jesus came to serve - Mark 10:42-45

Luke showed that Jesus is the Son of man - Luke 19:10

John showed that Jesus is the Son of God - John 20:30-31
